

## Bibliography – New Atheism, Intelligent Design, and Evolutionary Theology

Richard Dawkins, *The God Delusion*. This is all you will want to read of the “new atheists” and them some.

Alister McGrath and Joanna Collicut McGrath, *The Dawkins Delusion?* A brief, readable, soft-spoken response to Dawkins.

Keith Ward, *Why There Almost Certainly Is a God*. Another rebuttal by a distinguished theologian. I don't find his arguments totally convincing, however.

Michael J. Behe, *Darwin's Black Box*. The centerpiece of intelligent design “science.”

Kenneth R. Miller, *Only a Theory*. A good rebuttal of intelligent design from the point of view of genetics. Fun to Read.

Niall Shanks, *God, the Devil and Darwin*. A much more technical and hard-nosed rebuttal.

Mark Perakh, *Unintelligent Design*. This is the *magnum opus*. There is a particularly detailed discussion of William Dembski's work based on information theory.

John Haught, *God after Darwin*. If you are going to read only one book on evolutionary theology, I would choose this one. There are many other theologians who are worth reading on the subject. I will just quote names and you can research them for yourself: Arthur Peacocke, Keith Ward, Philip Clayton, Alister McGrath.

Jerry A. Coyne, *Why Evolution Is True*. A great introduction to evolution. Full of fascinating details.
