

Bibliography – Quantum Mechanics and Theology

Shimon Malin, *Nature Loves to Hide*, Oxford University Press, 2001 and Giancarlo Ghirardi, *Sneaking a Look at God's Cards*, Princeton University Press, 2005. These books explain quantum mechanics with a minimum of formalism. They are aimed at the general reader who is interested in the philosophical implications of QM. Are they good books? Look at the publishers.

Fritjof Capra, *The Tao of Physics*, Shambala, 1975 and Gary Zukav, *The Dancing Wu Li Masters*, William Morrow and Company, 1979. Two cult classics explore the connection between QM and Eastern Mysticism.

John Polkinghorne, *Quantum Physics and Theology*, Yale University Press, 2007. Polkinghorne, a physicist/priest/theologian, compares the methodology of physics as it went about discovering QM with methodology of Christian theology.
